An impressive classic Séguret - about as good as Côtes du Rhône-Villages gets!

Tasting Note

Paler ruby than some earlier vintages due to the extreme proportion of Grenache, the nose is however as explosive, plush and opulent as ever, layered with exotic spice, cracked black pepper and of course streaked with crushed vanillin. The palate is instantly appealing, polished and smooth on entry but steeped in depth and texture as the flavours swirl around, lengthen and delight. The lasting impression is satisfying - a big, opulent and sweet Grenache driven wine with obvious oak quality, g...

Producer Details

Our love affair with the southern Rhône is both enduring and unswerving. We believe to our marrow that we can make great wine here. And for this reason, we have bought our first vineyard in France, here in the southern Rhône – in the village of Cairanne, you'll not be surprised to learn! Ten years ago we first glimpsed the potential of the vineyards of Cairanne when we released our 2000 vintage of La Côte Sauvage. Now we have several plots of old vines we can call our own and begin to realise our dream of making even better wine. Over the past decade or so we have built enviable relationships with a network of local growers and we will of course continue to source grapes and wine from their trove of prized vineyards for our full range of Rhône wines.

In The Vineyard

Sourced from 'Les Turcs', a single 7ha east-facing terraced high altitude vineyard in the hills behind the village of Séguret, planted with mostly Grenache intermingled with some Syrah, vines whose minimum age is 50, many older still. The high altitude, old vines and very particular terroir make our Séguret quite unique. These are stony, argillaceous limestone terraces high above the schistous slopes of the village of Séguret. Here the grapes benefit from the morning sun and even ripening temperatures.

In The Winery

All the grapes are hand picked. Traditional long cuvaison using only indigenous yeasts and remontages to release all the potential of the grapes and their skins. 24 months in French oak 228 litre barrels and one quarter in 600 litre demi-muids, one third new, one third of 2nd fill and one third of 3rd & 4th fill.

Notes

The secret to the style and quality of our 2009 Séguret Les Coteaux Schisteux is twofold: firstly it is nearly 100% Grenache Noir and secondly over the years we have increasingly matured the wine in demi-muids. In our first vintage of 2003 we just used traditional 228 litre barriques, for instance. The proportion of wine to wood in a demi-muids is greater, so the oaky influence is more diffuse, gentler and more subtle, less dominant in other words. Moreover as we now have some older demi-muids; their influence is pivotal, as they bring far more complexity to the unity of the wine. When Grenache Noir from the southern Rhône excels as this does, it is sheer joy. It's been a long wait since the 2007, but we trust you'll find it worth it.
