

Château Bel Air AOC Bordeaux

“The colour is a deep ruby-red. The nose presents aromas of black fruit with hint of blackcurrant. In the mouth the powerful attack is perfectly counterbalanced by a tannic structure and an elegant finish. In the finish demonstrates suppleness and good length.”



Location: Blasimon

Total surface area of the vineyard:
52 hectares.

Soil:
Clay-lime stone soil on a rocky subsoil

Grape-varieties:
Merlot 50%, Cabernet Sauvignon 25%, Cabernet Franc 25%.

Vinification and maturing:
In accordance with the traditional Bordeaux methods: 15 to 21 days in stainless-steel vats with temperature control. 12 months' maturing with a period in Limousin oak barrels, part of which are 2 to 3 years old.

Average production:
85 000 bottles

History:
This Château dates back to the middle Ages, when the monks were just starting to plant vines. It was in 1929 that the Le Collen Family, later the Moysson-Le Collen family, purchased it. Located in the small village of Blasimon, the vineyard is planted on the hillsides overlooking the Dordogne River. Philippe Moysson, his wife, their children and grandchildren produce silky, fruity, wonderfully elegant wines here. They have a long history of friendship with Maison HEBRARD.
